

Social distancing requirements remain in place to maintain a distance of 1.5 metres away from people who you do not ordinality reside with.

It remains mandatory to carry a face covering at all times and wear a face mask while on public transport, in a commercial passenger vehicle, in an indoor hospital, care facility, retail shopping centre or retail facility with more than 2,000 sqm floorspace or at a market, unless an exemption applies.<sup>1</sup>

References to **electronic record-keeping** refer to the records requirements under the Workplace Directions which states records must be maintained of all workers and visitors who attend a premises for longer than 15 minutes (at a minimum). The record must include:

- 1. The person's first name
- 2. The person's contact number
- 3. The date and time at which the person attended the premises; and
- 4. The areas of the premises attended.
