PRESBYTERY NEWS

Presbytery Meeting

Members of Presbytery have been advised that the next meeting of the Presbytery will take place on Saturday 28th August on Zoom.

The agenda will include:

- A presentation by Peter Thomas, Director Property Services, about Essential Safety Measures that will impact every congregation
- A presentation by Rev Clare Brockett from Uniting Agewell
- A report and proposal about a change to the Presbytery staffing model
- Further activity about the way we relate to CALD congregations
- A report and proposal regarding the formation of a Covenanting Working Group
- Further discussion about the nature and expectations of congregations and presbytery oversight

Congregation Naming Convention

The Presbytery recently received correspondence from the General Secretary advising us of the adoption of a standard convention for congregation names. We are advised that the criteria to be used will assist in providing clarity and consistency for any future naming of congregations that may be established or result from an amalgamation. The criteria are:

- The name must indicate a location – a location which would be recognisable to external users, preferably a town or suburb;
- Saint names or street names appear in brackets following the town or suburb eg, Timbuktu (St Person) or Timbuktu (Main Street);
- For a Cluster: the name must include the word Cluster or Parish. Taking into consideration the removal of the Parish Regulations from the UCA's Constitution and Regulations, the preference is for 'Cluster' rather than 'Parish' eg, Timbuktu Cluster or Timbuktu (St Person) Cluster;
- Congregation names should not contain the words "Parish" or "Cluster" if they are only one congregation, even if they have multiple worship sites.

The aim of using these criteria across the Church is to make it easy for those seeking to locate or identify a congregation, as well as for both record keeping and record finding. It will be very helpful for presbyteries, congregations, the Synod, and individuals as resources, such as the Directory are accessed. It will also be helpful for developing continuity for use in annual returns, safe church information, etc.

While it has been clarified that it is not intended to mandate a change to existing names, the Presbytery Standing Committee requests and strongly encourages all Church Councils to give consideration to whether their name complies with the criteria above. If you wish to make change, this should be done through a minuted request to the Presbytery, since it is the Presbytery that has the responsibility to determine congregation names.

BOOK LAUNCH

You are warmly invited to the launch of Sally Douglas' new book.

The book *The Church Triumphant as Salt: Becoming the Community Jesus Speaks About* will be launched by Rev Dr Geoff Thompson and Rev Sharon Hollis at Pilgrim Theological College on Friday September 3 at 5.30pm

The Jesus community is called to be the salt of the earth, a metaphor that contains rich and disruptive challenge (Matthew 5.13). Salt is little. We weep salty tears and grow up in dark salty wombs. Salt preserves. Salt draws out taste and too much salt spoils everything. Engaging with the biblical text, early church writers and contemporary expressions of ministry Sally Douglas invites us to reassess the mantra that the church is dying. She demonstrates that while the cultural church – the church as the purity police, social club and friend of empire – is dying, we now have a rich opportunity to become more like the church Jesus speaks about.
