Readings

Isaiah 40:21-31

- ²¹ Have you not known? Have you not heard? Has it not been told you from the beginning? Have you not understood from the foundations of the earth? ²² It is he who sits above the circle of the earth, and its inhabitants are like grasshoppers, who stretches out the heavens like a curtain and spreads them like a tent to live in, ²³ who brings princes to naught and makes the rulers of the earth as nothing.
- ²⁴ Scarcely are they planted, scarcely sown, scarcely has their stem taken root in the earth, when he blows upon them, and they wither, and the tempest carries them off like stubble. ²⁵ To whom, then, will you compare me, or who is my equal? says the Holy One.
- ²⁶ Lift up your eyes on high and see: Who created these? He who brings out their host and numbers them, calling them all by name; because he is great in strength, mighty in power, not one is missing.
- ²⁷ Why do you say, O Jacob, and assert, O Israel, "My way is hidden from the LORD, and my right is disregarded by my God"? ²⁸ Have you not known? Have you not heard? The LORD is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He does not faint or grow weary; his understanding is unsearchable. ²⁹ He gives power to the faint and strengthens the powerless. ³⁰ Even youths will faint and be weary, and the young will fall exhausted, ³¹ but those who wait for the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles; they shall run and not be weary; they shall walk and not faint.

Mark 1:29-39

²⁹ As soon as they^[a] left the synagogue, they entered the house of Simon and Andrew, with James and John. ³⁰ Now Simon's mother-in-law was in bed with a fever, and they told him about her at once. ³¹ He came and took her by the hand and lifted her up. Then the fever left her, and she began to serve them. ³² That evening, at sunset, they brought to him all who were sick or possessed by demons. ³³ And the whole city was gathered around the door. ³⁴ And he cured many who were sick with various diseases and cast out many demons, and he would not permit the demons to speak, because they knew him.

³⁵ In the morning, while it was still very dark, he got up and went out to a deserted place, and there he prayed. ³⁶ And Simon and his companions hunted for him. ³⁷ When they found him, they said to him, "Everyone is searching for you." ³⁸ He answered, "Let us go on to the neighbouring towns, so that I may proclaim the message there also, for that is what I came out to do." ³⁹ And he went throughout all Galilee, proclaiming the message in their synagogues and casting out demons.

Sermon Rev Tina - The power of God's love *In the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, amen.*





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Jesus' ministry began in Galilee, in the synagogues, the places where the community gathered and in homes, where friends and family offered hospitality and cared for one another. The context and worldview promoted a climate of anxiety, with beliefs in bad spirits and fear of war and Romans due to political and spiritual unrest. It was just before the Romans destroyed Jerusalem, the Temple, and a way of life.



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Jesus' disciples bring him home and Simon Peter's mother-in-law is in bed with a fever and cannot offer hospitality. Jesus goes to her, risks ritual impurity by touching her that would have excluded him from synagogues and takes her hand and raises her up and she is healed. Immediately she offers him hospitality. Then the entire village turns up on the doorstep expecting him to heal everyone and cast out spirits. Perhaps this ministry left him feeling exhausted, and he goes out to pray on the mountain at dawn and finds strength to continue his journey to other villages where he teaches in synagogues and casts out demons. This mindset, spirituality and healing is alien to us. Yet, we live in a society where anxiety, fear and oppression are a problem. We live with many worries and anxieties.

Isaiah the prophet and the people he ministered to also lived with anxiety and fear. They were refugees and exiles and were feeling a sense of failure, fear, humiliation, and grief.

The people feel lost and need hope. Hope that will give them courage to keep on trying, questing, striving, and seeking to find a new way forward and meaning in their lives, where they find hope in a world dominated by emperors, armies, and wars. Where doubts are holding them back from embracing God's message of hope.

The world and cosmos are complex, and the people find it difficult to believe that one God controls their destiny. Isaiah invites them into the mystery of God and calls them to stop focusing on death all around them and idols such as wealth, status, and false gods. He says wake up. Have you not heard? Stop forgetting the fundamental teachings of your tradition.

He does his best to encourage them to turn to God as their source of strength. He encourages them in words that are expressed a lovely piece of poetry, which most of us know well from a popular hymn.

Isaiah 40:31 Those who wait for the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles; they shall run and not be weary; they shall walk and not faint.

Wait for the Lord who unites life in a way that brings hope and joy. Open your minds and hearts to the majesty of God and find your place of belonging in a vast universe. God loves you and will set you free from whatever burdens you. The Lord will deliver you. Hope for the future.

He may well have been speaking to us. Isaiah's message is timeless and eternal.

We must wait on the Lord. We need to trust and surrender our lives to God. God never grows weary. God gives power to the faint and strengthens the powerless. God calls us to make God central in our lives. Making God central in our lives gives us courage and strength where we are no longer helpless and at the mercy of fear, anxiety, and despair.

We need to be open to God's great power over our lives.

Kierkegaard, a theologian, said: "As long as we harbour other ultimate loyalties besides God, we are lost in a sea of chaos."



Augustine shared from personal experience: "You Lord have made us for yourself, and our hearts are restless until they rest in you."

God dispels our fears and takes away our anxieties, sorrows and worries and fills us with love, peace, and light, and invites us to be bearers of the gospels message of hope. We look to Jesus who has taught us how to lift others out of misery and sadness, because that is what he does for us when we turn to him as our source of life and hope.

All that chains our hearts, falls away.


